By-Laws of the IACA Technical Committee

November 2008

1. Role & Objectives

The IACA Technical Committee shall:

- a) Advise the IACA Executive, IACA Committee and National Access Class Associations regarding class rules and technical matters
- b) Consider applications for replacement or additional equipment
- c) Report to the IACA Executive through the Committee Chairperson

2. Membership

Members of the IACA Technical Committee shall be appointed by the IACA Executive or General Meeting and comprise:

- a) The IACA Vice-President Rules & Measurement as Chairman. In the absence of the IACA Vice-President Rules & Measurement, the IACA President or Executive Officer may serve as Chairperson
- b) Class Representatives for the Access 2.3, Access 303, Access Liberty, SKUD 18 and any other classes that may be adopted by the IACA
- c) Additional expert members of the Committee may be co-opted with approval of the IACA Executive or General Meeting

3. Meetings

- a) Meetings shall be convened as required either in person, via teleconference or by email exchange
- b) Sixty days notice shall be provided for meetings in person
- c) Seven days notice shall be provided for teleconferences
- d) Email exchanges can take place at any time

4. Quorum & Voting

- a) Participation by any three members shall constitute a quorum
- b) No decision affecting a particular class may be taken in the absence of the delegate for that class
- c) Each member of the Committee has one vote. Should it be necessary to break a tie, the Chairperson has an additional, or casting, vote.

5. Applications for Replacement or Additional Equipment

- a) The IACA Technical Committee has authority to approve, reject or make recommendations regarding applications for replacement or additional equipment
- b) The Secretary of the IACA shall be advised of all decisions of the Technical Committee and maintain a register of approved equipment that is displayed on the IACA website
- c) Decisions of the Technical Committee may be appealed to the IACA Executive by writing to the IACA Secretary
